- The first part of the evening will take a short look at national data before exploring the science behind boys' brains and learning approaches.
- The main focus of the course however, will consider a number of **successful strategies for the classroom**. There should be some time to discuss how heads of departments, faced with a number of disengaged and under achieving boys, can take a more pro-active stance in **changing boys' attitudes to learning** and persuade them to **retain more course content**.
